Meter Conversion Program

- Ongoing replacement
- 2002: Implemented Automated Meter Reading (AMR) technology
- 2014: Adopted Advanced Metering
 Infrastructure (AMI) with Badger Meter, Inc.
- 2019: Issued a Request for Proposals for AMI
- 2021: Awarded a contract to Badger Meter to replace remaining AMR meters in W1 and W4 (13,727)



Communication Equipment Challenges

- Initial AMI endpoint (Code Division Multiple Access or CDMA) failures (R1 and W2)
- CDMA 3G technology retired end of 2022
- June 2022: Board approved PO for Badger and Concord Utility Services to replace
 7,515 CDMA endpoints with new long-term evolution (LTE) endpoints

- August 2022: 899 communication failures
- September 2022: 1,396 communication failures
