#### **Recommendation**

Request the Commissioners authorize the Administrative Officer to execute the labor contract for the amount of \$86,568.00 to Doty Bros.

#### **Background Information**

The construction for the Metro Gold Line Foothill Extension Construction Authority's (Construction Authority) design-build project is currently underway to extend the Foothill Gold Line from Glendora to Pomona. The project involves the design and construction of the new light rail system and relocation of existing freight rail system. Due to this project, the Construction Authority requested Pomona-Walnut-Rowland Joint Water Line's (PWR-JWL) facilities to be relocated outside of the railroad's right-of-way (ROW).

PWR-JWL has two facilities that are currently located within the ROW on E Street just north of Arrow Highway in the City of La Verne. The existing 81" steel casing, encasing existing 60" reinforced concrete pipe, will be extended approximately 5 feet outside of the ROW. Two existing 6-inch vents, located the west side of E Street, will be relocated to the proposed sidewalk island.

Labor bids were solicited and received by WVWD staff.

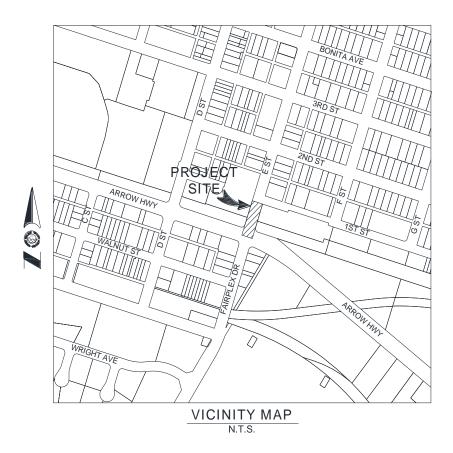
